LEAP—Lakes Eclair Access Project

Lakes DHB is implementing a shared repository so that authorised clinicians will be able to view laboratory results for patients under their care. The reasoning behind this new initiative is to improve the quality and safety of care of the patient, to provide clinicians faster access to information, and to prevent patients from undergoing further, and/or repeating tests.

Protecting yourselves and your family

The National Immunisation Service provides free immunisations against some diseases, however there are other non-funded vaccines that you can buy and may be worth considering:

Gardasil—HPV is thought to be the common sexually transmitted infection in the world. Most sexually active adults will be infected with HPV at some time in their lives. At the moment Gardasil is funded for all girls aged 11–20 years of age. However, although not funded for males it is recommended that boys within the 9–26 year age group have this vaccine. The HPV vaccination involves 3 doses spread over 6 months.

Zostavax— Shingles is a viral infection, the first symptom of which is usually a sharp, tingling pain under the skin, followed by a red rash and blisters, it is extremely painful. Shingles is caused by the same virus as chicken pox. After a bout of chicken pox the virus lies latent in the nerve cells where it remains for life, it can reactivate as shingles.

Boostrix— is a combined adult vaccine against whooping cough, diphtheria and tetanus and is funded for children at 11 years of age and pregnant women between 28–38 weeks gestation. A booster is recommended for close adult contacts or new-borns i.e., grandparents

ADT (Adult Diphtheria, Tetanus) - this vaccine is partially funded for those aged 45 and 65 years of age.
